Macular Society Counselling Service

The Macular Society runs various counselling sessions with details below.

CBS Group

This is a 6 session group for people who are experiencing visual hallucinations caused by eye disease (Charles Bonnet Syndrome).

The group allows for people to share their experiences and together come up with strategies and ways of coping. The topics discussed are led by the group members themselves and what they feel they would benefit from working on.

The Macular society is running two telephone groups.

The criteria for both groups is that participants have a form of Macular Disease, and our age range is 16 plus. Everyone who is referred will be offered a telephone assessment to make sure that group work is going to be helpful. If this is not the case they will look into alternative sources of support, such as individual sessions or signposting to another agency.

Their groups are facilitated by a counsellor who will help to keep the focus of the group and enable everyone to have an opportunity to share should they wish to do so.

If you decide to join a group you will be given the joining details which involves dialling a telephone number to access a conference call. Each group runs for 6 weeks. You can refer yourself online <https://www.macularsociety.org/form/counselling-referral> or by calling 0300 3030 111.

Adjusting to Sight Loss

This is a new group which is being trialled and is open to anyone with a form of Macular Disease who would like to speak with others who are navigating the changes brought about by sight loss. This could be practical issues as well as the emotional impact.

Lastly they have expertise within their counselling team in providing counselling to young people & families within a wellbeing setting.

Fight for Sight

Fight for Sight have been raising awareness of the disproportionate impact people with eye conditions are facing as a result of the pandemic. In June they released the findings of their survey of people with eye conditions/sight loss in the UK which showed that 73% of people were having difficulty accessing treatment as a result of the lockdown, with 4 in 10 people fearing their eyesight would further deteriorate as a result. With the ever-changing landscape and lockdown restrictions, they are asking for people to take part in a follow-up survey about how the pandemic is continuing to affect them.
